

Insert into revegetation factsheet

This fact sheet is intended as a useful guide for landscape planners and home owners who are looking to create a garden using local native plants. Choosing the correct species to revegetate around the Darebin Creek Catchment is an important facet of landscape planning. It is preferred that revegetation be indigenous, meaning local to the area. These plants are best evolved to the soil type and local conditions and are least likely to be invasive and become pest plant species. Revegetation should take place when any flora is removed from a site, or when it is recommended that buildings be screened from the park area adjacent to Darebin Creek. The following is a list of species recommended for planting in the Darebin Creek Catchment. Specific mention is given to the suitability of plants for screening purposes.
